Kimmerle's project is a desire to defend Schleiermacher against the criticism of Gadamer, by making available his early theories on hermeneutics

The view that Schleiermacher neglected language, as Kimmerle points out, comes from Dilthey's account of him in "The Rise of Hermeneutics" (New Literary History 3 [1971-72]), and Dilthey in turn relied on
